HOW ST ALOYSIUS CATHOLIC JUNIOR SCHOOL USED THE GRANT IN 2015/2016

Amount of grant received – 2015-2016 £9158

P.E./Sport Lead was released to ensure that the organisation and delivery of sporting competitions was done effectively. The P.E. Sport Lead attended key meetings as part of the C.S.S.A. executive committee
Spend -£2000

Any new sports coach is observed by the P.E/Sport Lead. We funded qualified coaching in afterschool clubs for basketball (x2), tag rugby, football, cricket, netball (X2), gymnastics and dance(x2). We also had a member of staff involved with all sports based after school clubs. Spending - £7025

Each year we 'buy' into the C.S.S.A and Camden Schools Sports Partnership. This allows us not only to participate in the competitive sporting events but it also enables us to give many more children the chance to participate in sport4all and inclusion events. Spend -£450

In the autumn term of 2015 the P.E./Sport Lead worked with a P.E. consultant to evaluate the next steps for improving our P.E. provision. This led to objectives for each unit of P.E. being developed. Spending - £500

In the summer half term of 2016 we sent 36 pupils (12 boys and 24 girls) on a cricket residential course at Arundel. This event was subsidised by the school in regards to the cost for the children and sending support staff to supervise. Spending - £2265

We worked in partnership with a local secondary school to complete their Young Leaders Course. We provided pupils so that those taking the course could be assessed. The reciprocal agreement was that in the summer term when there was more flexibility with the time table we sent classes for P.E. lessons.

The link with Highgate Harriers continued. Children were supported in their preparation for the Camden Schools Cross country event. The club set out the course as on the event day for pupils to practice.

In 2015 we made a link with a local gymnastics club. They not only provide an afterschool coach but we are able to use their facilities to prepare pupils for the Key Steps gymnastics Competition. This continued this year. Spend - £300

Our other links include a netball club for girls who demonstrate talent in the sport, Regents Park Cricket Club and Hampstead Rugby Club.

Our annual Sports Day/Week provided pupils with the opportunity to compete against the other 'houses' in the school. It ended with the winning house being announced in a special assembly. Spend - £120

Year 6 pupils went on school journey to the Isle of Wight for a week. Activities they participated in included; abseiling, climbing, team building activities and confidence building activities.

The popularity of the afterschool dance club led to pupils participating in the Camden Schools Dance Festival.

We used links with other local secondary schools (such as La Sainte Union) to assist us in training pupils who were involved with the School Games.

Capital Kids Cricket were involved to a much greater depth this year with each Year group receiving coaching throughout the year. Spend - £2350

IMPACT

- **The school won first place in the overall 'Race for Camden' – this included us winning the netball, tag rugby, and Indoor Athletics events**
- **For the third year in a row we were recognised as being the most inclusive school in the Camden Awards. This award recognises our dedication to encouraging as many pupils to participate in as many events as possible.**
- **Last year between 140-150 pupils represented the school in a sporting event.**
- **The after school clubs provided 80-100 pupils with sporting opportunities. These were all offered free of charge.**

HOW ST ALOYSIUS CATHOLIC PRIMARY SCHOOL HAVE PLANNED TO USE THE GRANT IN 2016/2017

(Amount of grant received – 2016-2017 £9,175)

- P.E./Sport Lead to work in conjunction with a P.E. advisor in preparation for the joining of our infant and junior school as one school (looking at the curriculum and quality of teaching).
- PE faculty Lead is to work closely with the Sports Coach Lead to ensure lessons of a high standard are being delivered across the whole primary school and that the organisation and participation in all sporting events entered runs smoothly.
- C.S.S.A and Camden Schools Traded Services for Competition and Participation fee allowing us not only to participate in the competitive sporting events but give many more children the chance to participate in sport4all and inclusion events.
- Afterschool clubs in Key Stage 2 (from September 2016) – Cricket (x2), Dance(x2), Football, Basketball (x2), Gymnastics (x2), Netball (x2) and Tag Rugby.
- Setting up after school clubs for Early Years and Key Stage 1 (January onwards)
- Link with a local gymnastics club to prepare pupils for the Key Steps gymnastics Competition.
- More active updating of the school website to promote sporting events, pupils' achievements and the PE curriculum.
- Set up a school sports committee.
